



SOURCING FROM CONFLICT-AFFECTED & HIGH-RISK AREAS

PURPOSE

This document is intended to explain how Qorvo determines if some of the relevant minerals¹ used in the supply chain may be sourced from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas (CAHRAs)², and the limitations on the information we can share with our customers regarding that sourcing.

RCOI DATA

As a member of the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI), Qorvo has access to Reasonable Country of Origin (RCOI) information that non-members do not. For the smelters/refiners (SORs) that undergo and pass the Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP) or a cross-recognized assessment (LBMA or RJC), RMI members receive aggregated sourcing data in the following format:

L1 – relates to the former RMAP standard and indicates the SOR may be sourcing (directly or indirectly) from countries that are not identified as conflict regions or plausible areas for smuggling materials from the Covered Countries³.

L2 – relates to the former RMAP standard and indicates the SOR may be sourcing (directly or indirectly) from countries with known smuggling routes in the Covered Countries.

CC (formerly L3) – indicates the SOR may be sourcing (directly or indirectly) from countries known as the Covered Countries under the *Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act*, section 1502.

DRC – indicates the SOR may be sourcing (directly or indirectly) from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).

LR – relates to the RMAP's revised standard and indicates the SOR may be sourcing (directly or indirectly) from low-risk countries of origin, as defined and verified by the SOR's procedure to identify conflict-affected and high-risk areas.

HR – relates to the RMAP's revised standard and indicates the SOR may be sourcing (directly or indirectly) from high-risk countries of origin, as defined and verified by the SOR's procedure to identify conflict-affected and high-risk areas.

R/S – indicates the SOR processes only recycled or scrap materials.

DISCLAIMER

This level of sourcing detail is only available for RMAP conformant smelters and refiners. Qorvo does not know the actual mine location or specific countries that a SOR may source materials from. In addition, the use of this data is bound by the terms set forth in the relevant Agreements for the Exchange of Confidential Information between the RMI and the individual SORs. Qorvo cannot disclose the specific sourcing data for a smelter or refiner, even in meeting SEC reporting obligations. The information can only be shared in an aggregated format. For example, Qorvo may state "the smelters and refiners in Qorvo's supply chain may source from L1, LR and CC locations".

¹ Conflict-Affected and High Risk Areas - The OECD defines conflict-affected and high-risk areas as areas identified by the presence of armed conflict, widespread violence or other risks of harm to people. Armed conflict may take a variety of forms, such as conflict of international or non-international character, which may involve two or more states, or may consist of wars of liberation, or insurgencies, civil wars, etc. High-risk areas may include areas of political instability or repression, institutional weakness, insecurity, collapse of civil infrastructure and widespread violence. Such areas are often characterized by widespread human rights abuses and violations of national or international law.

² Relevant Minerals - For the purposes of Qorvo's responsible minerals program, relevant minerals include tin, tantalum, tungsten, gold, cobalt, and any other mineral identified by Qorvo as contributing possible risk to the supply chain.

³ Covered Countries – Democratic Republic of the Congo, Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia
